Revisiting Gamification

In recent years, the incorporation of gamification in our English classes and mediations has gained considerable attention as an effective strategy to enhance student engagement and motivation. In the realm of English language teaching, where the development of language skills may sometimes be a challenging endeavor, gamification has emerged as a promising approach to make the learning process more enjoyable and memorable. By integrating game elements and mechanics into the language learning context, educators have been able to create immersive and interactive experiences that foster active participation, collaboration, and intrinsic motivation among other multiple benefits. Let's revisit some principles and implications of gamification at the CCA.

A. The Why and the How of Gamifying the Learning Experience

- ✓ Involves the application of game-like mechanics to non-game contexts or purposes, such as English Language learning.
- ✓ Encourages a specific response or behavior.
- ✓ Geared towards the achievement of a particular learning objective.
- ✓ Uses features like points, levels, and rewards to enhance student engagement and motivation.
- ✓ Creates an interactive and enjoyable learning experience similar to a game.
- ✓ Can involve educational games, online platforms, or gamified activities.
- ✓ Can be applied to various language learning aspects like vocabulary, grammar, listening, and speaking.



B. Gamification helps...

- gain higher levels of engagement and motivation,
- ✓ improve focus,
- ✓ lower the affective filter/anxiety,
- ✓ develop problem-solving skills,
- ✓ strengthen teamwork and collaboration,
- ✓ and obtain instant and personalized feedback.

D. A Few Examples of the Application of Gamification in the EFL Classroom

- ✓ Vocabulary Challenges: Create vocabulary challenges where students earn points or badges for correctly identifying and using new words in context. This could involve word quizzes, word-building games, or vocabulary scavenger hunts.
- Leaderboards: Display a leaderboard that ranks students based on their achievements and progress in different language learning tasks. This fosters healthy competition and motivates students to actively participate and improve their skills.
- ✓ Language Quests: Design language quests or missions that require students to complete specific language tasks or challenges. For

- example, they could solve language puzzles, write a short story, or record a dialogue. Completing each quest successfully earns them points or unlocks new levels.
- ✓ Interactive Quizzes: Convert traditional quizzes into interactive and engaging experiences. Use online quiz platforms that provide immediate feedback and rewards for correct answers. Students can compete against each other or try to beat their previous scores.
- ✓ Virtual Language Olympics:

 Organize language Olympics where students participate in various language-related competitions, such as spelling bees, pronunciation challenges, or rapid-fire vocabulary quizzes. Medals or certificates can be awarded to winners.





E. Some Rules of Thumb...



Assess the activity: Use self-assessment for learners to feel free to make mistakes and self-correct.



Assess the activity: Use teacher and peer-assessment.



Align Gamification with the objectives of the class.





Challenge students with the activity: It should not be too easy or too difficult.



Students need to receive feedback: Given by the activity or by the teacher.

One of the events was a workshop titled "Taller de construcción de alas" (Wing Building Workshop). It took place on June 15th, 2023, at Universidad Ean. The objective of the workshop was to construct butterfly wings while providing an opportunity for dialogue on inclusion, diversity, and the sharing of experiences.





The second event was a webinar called "Conversaciones sobre inclusión y buenas prácticas en educación" (Conversations on Inclusion and Best Practices in Education).
